# Sample Job Description for Clinical Radiology

A strong job description will detail the following:-

#### 1. Job details -

- Post no longer than two years, no shorter than six months
- Evidence of appropriate funding
- Clearly states number of hours a week

#### 2. Job title

• Clinical Radiology MTI Fellow/Trainee.

## 3. Job purpose

- Training personal development
- Audit/QI/FRCR exams

#### 4. Job summary

- Evidence that the trainee will rotate in their job plan to work in all the main tumour types
- Encompasses a period of higher speciality training as set out in the RCR speciality curriculum
- Relevant special interest area
- Only undertake Radiology on-call once MTI trainee has been assessed as competent to be included on the rota
- Must not include hospital at night/acute medical on-call commitments
- **5. Example job plan/timetable** see below for example timetable

## 6. Main duties and responsibilities of post

• E.g. clinics, wards, chemotherapy prescribing, radiotherapy planning

### 7. Person Specification

- Essential criteria: one year clinical radiology experience/ One year internship (House Doctor) post/ Completion of at least three years of full-time equivalent postgraduate training/ Successful pass of the IELTS or OET exam
- **Desirable** MRCP/ Parts of FRCR passed/ Local radiology qualifications

## 8. Important additional information relating to employment/other responsibilities

• E.g. hospital beds, radiology beds, radiology dept. spec, close working with other specialties
