## **1** ALERTS AND SOCIALS

Sign up to curated resources such as NEJM journal watch

Follow relevant accounts on social media

 E.g. journals, colleges and societies, key clinicians and academics

### 2 ATTEND CONFERENCES

These can rapidly refresh your knowledge and offer opportunities for face-to-face conversations

Meet locally after major conferences to share 'key messages'





#### **3** KEEP KEY INFORMATION ACCESSIBLE

Keep a folder of key papers relevant to your clinical practice, regularly update it, and share it with your team and trainees

Make use of guidelines and clinical topic summaries

Listen to podcasts, such as Clinical Oncology, ASCO, JAMA Oncology and Rad Chat

Helpful tools include UpToDate, ClinicalKey, EvidenceAlerts, and MedNet

## EXCHANGE INFORMATION WITH COLLEAGUES

Develop broad networks and take the time to talk to peers in other hospitals

Schedule regular time with your team to share learning such as journal clubs
