All trainees (except those due to achieve their Certificate of Completion of Training (CCT) before September 2022) must transfer to the new curricula.

The General Medical Council (GMC) have approved new curricula for clinical and interventional radiology. The key changes are:

Concise

There are 12 outcomes for clinical radiology, plus an additional two for interventional radiology, with brief tables outlining presentations, conditions and procedures and avoiding granular detail.

Outcomes based

High-level learning outcomes, called capabilities in practice (CiPs) describe what a trainee should be able to do on completion of training.

Intuitive

Assessment of the CiPs is based on entrustment scales to support professional judgement of trainees' progress.

Clear about expectations

Progression grids provide clear expectations of progress at each stage of training.

Future proof

They are designed to prepare trainees for working within a rapidly changing service, with emerging techniques and technology.

There will be no changes to examinations or workplace-based assessment requirements.
